The ARREST trial **opened for recruitment in the catchment areas of St Thomas' and King's College Hospitals on Monday, 15th January 2018.** A huge thank you to all who made this possible. We are especially grateful to all the local site staff who facilitated the opening of the trial at their centres. We look forward to opening the remaining sites soon. Background of the ARREST trial

The aim of ARREST is to determine the best post-resuscitation care pathway for cardiac arrest patients without ST-segment elevation. It will recruit 860 patients, with 430 in each arm. Patients in the treatment arm will be go to a heart attack centre and patients in the control arm will be taken to the closest emergency department.

A pilot trial was conducted between November 2014 and March 2016 which enrolled 40 patients. No safety concerns were identified, and the feasibility of a large scale trial was confirmed. A paper summarising the results was published in 2017 (Patterson et al, Resuscitation, 2017).

The ARREST trial is funded by the British Heart Foundation, and sponsored by King's College London. The Chief Investigator is Simon Redwood, and the Clinical Lead is Tiffany Patterson. The trial is working in close partner-ship with the London Ambulance Service.

Meet the LAS Research Paramedics

Johanna Hughes and Helen Werts are Research Paramedics working on the ARREST trial for the London Ambulance Service. Their role is to liaise with the designated hospital staff when trial patients are received at their site, and then track the patient's progress once in hospital. They are responsible for gaining surviving trial patients' consent for follow-up, where possible.

Johanna and Helen will be in frequent contact with all the sites throughout the trial.


